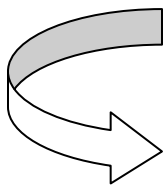

J The Spirited and Sometimes Explosive Child

Mary Goldstein, Licensed Clinical Social Worker

Often called "difficult" or "strong-willed," these children can overwhelm parents and caregivers, leaving them frustrated and inadequate. Spirited kids are, in fact, simply "more", more intense, sensitive, perceptive, persistent, and uncomfortable with change than the average child. In this workshop you will learn to understand both the child's and your temperament traits, plan for success with a simple four-step program (plus 3-step collaborative problem solving plan), discover the power of positive, rather than negative, labels, cope with tantrums and blowups when they do occur, and develop strategies for handling mealtimes, bedtimes, holidays, school, and many other situations.
